

# Magnolia Plantation and Gardens Ashley, South Carolina

Located Northwest of downtown Charleston is the 390-acre complex of Magnolia Plantation and Gardens. It is partially on the Ashley River and is open almost year around. This is an incredibly beautiful, well-laid-out complex of gardens, with many walkways throughout and along the river, a wedding venue, zoo, house, and much more. They offer boat tours, tram tours, tours of the house, gardens, and more. It is one of those places you would want to come early and stay for most of the day.

As you walk along the paved trail beside the river, you might see an alligator or watch birds as they dry in the sun or swim in the river. The gardens have been open to visitors since 1870 and as your garden has changed over the years, so has this one. Many of the large oak trees have been here for years and are so large and beautiful with the Spanish moss hanging from them. There are many benches and seating areas along the paths so you can sit, relax, take in the beauty, and just notice all the little things, like birds flying in and out of the trees, bees on the flowers, and a dragonfly or two of different color flying around you.

I highly recommend you visit Magnolia Plantation and Gardens if you are in the Charleston, South Carolina area. There are probably enough places to see and things to do in and around this town that you can easily spend a week with. Also, the seafood and other restaurants in this area are worth the trip!
