<u>Florída Keys</u>

Since I retired in 2007, I have spent 3 separate winters in Florida. In 2014 I explored part of the Florida Keys. The Keys are about 120 miles of islands that begin south of Miami. Most of the Keys can only be reached by boat. There is much to do here, and we kept busy for three weeks. We were very lucky to find an RV park that offered us space with our private beach and a view of the birding activity which occurred each morning. There are over 300 species of birds that are commonly seen in the Keys including white Ibis, double-crested Cormorant, American white and brown pelicans, herons, egrets, and many more.

In Key Largo, there is Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park which offers glass-bottom boats which take you over the coral reefs and you can see turtles, coral, and fish. The Park employees point out each one and give you much information during the boat ride. The State Park also offers snorkeling and tours of the Mangrove swamps.

The main attraction for most tourists is Key West. This is a very interesting city with tram and walking tours. If you want to see all it offers it will take 2-3 days. It is fun to walk around the city and see all the chickens running loose and it amazed me how close the large cruise ships would dock to the city.

Southern Florida is worth the drive. On the way you can stop at Walt Disney World, Daytona Speedway, Everglades National Park, and much more to keep you entertained no matter what you enjoy doing. Please try to visit!
