Learning Health and Nutrition Skills in Food Project

Simply put, 4-H is a youth program that teaches kids life skills like responsibility, team work, sportsmanship, leadership and integrity; all while they have fun and participate in various projects in multiple areas and types!

How do I become involved in the 4-H Program?

Here are some tips to become a part of Guadalupe Co.:

- ◆ Be between Kinder-2nd Grade for Clover Kids (\$10) or 3rd grade-12th grade and still in High School.
- ◆ Find a 4-H Club close to you to join
- ◆ Sign up on 4-H Connect (texas.4honline.com) to become an official member
- ◆ The cost is only \$25 per child, you pay when you sign up on 4-H Connect before Oct 31, \$30 after!
- ◆ If you need ANY help trying to use the 4-H Connect system or have any questions, please contact the county extension office
- ◆ All 4-H adult volunteers also sign up on 4-H Connect and are screened and cleared before they can participate; this keeps our kids safe too!

The only way **not** to have a great time in 4-H is to not get involved!!! SO, sign up, join a club and get ready to have the time of your life, you will always remember what you learn in 4-H and most of all, you will have fun!!!
