New 4-H Year, New 4-H Publications

Welcome to the new 4-H Year! This 4-H Gazette will be the main source for 4-H information in the county! We will also use Facebook and Instagram to provide the most up to date info. This has the information to enroll in 4-H. It is \$25 from now till November 1 at which point it goes to \$30. 4-H is for kids 3^{rd} grade and 8 years old to 12^{th} grade; for the clover kids, aged Kinder- 2^{nd} grade, the cost is \$10 because there are some things clovers cannot do. Clover kids cannot show animals, do shooting sports or ride horses, but we try to give them as many opportunities as possible. We would like each family to have at least one screened and cleared parent which is also done on 4-H Online and is \$10.

You will need to choose a 4-H club to join and a project to put down. If you are planning to show livestock, the Livestock guide is helpful for new 4-Hers starting out, as well as for learning how to get buyers at the county youth show. Kids can show at the county youth show in livestock, baked goods, handicrafts, photography and ag mech...this show is in January and the deadline to enter is November 15. District 10 4-H Photography Project Members looking to take their photography project to the next level should register to attend the upcoming Junior Master Photography Workshops. The Texas 4-H Junior Master Photographer program is designed to develop intermediate and senior youth leaders through a series of in-depth work-shops and hands-on practice events. Once awarded, the Texas 4-H Junior Master Photographer certification does not expire, nor does it require renewal. Members must attend (2) mandatory workshops with \$50 registration fee for each. To advance to a State Photography Ambassador, youth must first become a certified Junior Master Photographer to be eligible to become an ambassador. Information: The newly updated Quality Counts learner experience is LIVE! Please encourage your exhibitors to begin completing the course and exam. As a reminder, all exhibitors are required to provide a verified QC number at the time of major livestock show entry. Again – this new process/exam is NOT required for everyone. Only those users who are new or are moving to the next grade level course (junior: 3-5th grade, intermediate: 6-8th, senior: 9-12th) are required to take Quality Counts this year. It is critical that users follow the **NEW QC Enrollment Instructions 2023** for the new experience. Please share this document every time you remind your exhibitors/ families. Broiler Orders Coming Due

- Major show broiler orders will be due Friday, Sept. 1. Birds are \$1.50 each and will be ordered in increments of 25 (25, 50 or 75) per exhibitor or family.

- County broiler orders will be due Friday, Sept. 29. Birds are \$1.75 each and will be ordered in increments of 25 or 50 per exhibitor or family.

- Pick up dates will be posted at a later date.

Swine Tag Orders Coming Due

Swine tag orders due Tuesday, September 19. Tags will be \$20 each. Validations will be held held November 16, 2-7 p.m. at the Fairgrounds.

Heifer Validation

your heifer is already validated, you need not do it again unless she has changed ownership or breed. If you ordered tags in the spring but did not validate in June, and want to validate in October, please let us know. Your tags will still be available to use.

County Stock Show Entry Night

Will be held Wednesday, November 15 until 6:30pm at the county extension office. Do not wait until the last minute to register for the youth show and major shows! Forms should be out by the beginning of October!

Quality Counts Program (Required for ALL Major Shows)

Quality Counts is designed to teach young people the importance of displaying good character in carrying out livestock projects, and in every aspect of their lives. Exhibitors will have to complete the test once it is started. Exhibitors must achieve 80% or great to pass the exam, but can take it as many times as needed. Exhibitors will be tested on the content potentially three times in their livestock showing career: junior (grade 3-5), intermediate (grade 6-8), and senior (grade 9-12).
