ALL Stock Show Entry Night, Nov 15

On Wednesday, November 15, the county extension office will be hosting its annual County Stock show Entry Night till 6:30. Entry Night will be held at the COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE AT 210 E. LIVE OAK! This is RE-QUIRED for any-one wanting to show at the County Youth Show or Major Stock Shows in 2024. You will be able to come in and fill out forms before then, but this WILL BE THE LAST POSSIBLE DAY!!! Your first stop at entry night will be with Matt to check your enrollment on 4-H Connect. If you are not enrolled, then you can not show! YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SIGN UP FOR MAJOR SHOWS OR THE YOUTH SHOW UNLESS YOU ARE ENROLLED.

Finish the night with Jeff, Kim and Travis to fill out your paperwork, get final questions answered and all registered for the shows! Remember to have your QUALITY COUNTS tests done! If you need to take them, visit <u>https://www.texaslivestockvalidation.com/qc/qcregister.aspx</u>. You must complete this BEFORE you come to entry night, as the test can take up to two hours to complete. Entry Night is for all stock show contests including robotics, science fairs, shooting contests, photography and more. If you have any questions, let us know! REMEMBER, you MUST have your SSN on the forms when you turn them in or the entry is NOT complete!!!

NEW, Late Fee Now In Place for Late Stock Show Entries

New for the 2023-2024 4-H Year, there will be a late fee of \$100 per exhibitor incurred for entries submitted on or after November 20, 2023. Entry forms for Ft. Worth Show are now available at the office and on our website. We hope to have all forms for the other major shows and the Guadalupe County Youth Show available very soon. Ft. Worth Forms are DUE NO LATER than November 10. All others are DUE NOVEMBER 15.

This has the information to enroll in 4-H. It is \$25 from now till November I at which point it goes to \$30. 4-H is for kids 3rd grade and 8 years old to 12th grade; for the clover kids, aged Kinder-2nd grade, the cost is \$10 because there are some things clovers cannot do. Clover kids cannot show animals, do shooting sports or ride horses, but we try to give them as many opportunities as possible. We would like each family to have at least one screened and cleared parent which is also done on 4-H Online and is \$10.

You will need to choose a 4-H club to join and a project to put down. The next document has a list of our 4-H clubs, when and where they meet. <u>https://guadalupe.agrilife.org/files/2023/08/23-24-CLub-Manager-List.pdf</u> Next is the 4-H Yearbook. If you are planning to show livestock, the Livestock guide is helpful for new 4-Hers starting out, as well as for learning how to get buyers at the county youth show. Kids can show at the county youth show in livestock, baked goods, handicrafts, photography and ag mech...this show is in January and the deadline to enter is November 15. 2023 Quality Counts Information Now Available

Information: The newly updated Quality Counts learner experience is LIVE! Please encourage your exhibitors to begin completing the course and exam. As a reminder, all exhibitors are required to provide a verified QC number at the time of major livestock show entry. Again – this new process/exam is NOT required for everyone. Only those users who are new or are moving to the next grade level course (junior: 3-5th grade, intermediate: 6-8th, senior: 9-12th) are required to take Quality Counts this year. It is critical that users follow the **NEW QC En-rollment Instructions 2023** for the new experience. Please share this document every time you remind your exhibitors/families. Texas 4-H Congress Leadership Team Apps

Texas 4-H Congress is a four-day mock legislative experience for 4-H members in grades 9th to 12th (at the time of the event). During this time, 4-H members assume the roles of legislators, lobbyists, and press corps to gain a first-hand understanding of how the legislative process works. Bills that are written and sponsored by 4-H members focus on issues concerning Texas and Texas youth. These bills are assigned to the appropriate committee, debated in committee meetings, and then on the floor of the House or Senate. If a bill is successful in negotiation and the legislative debate in all three stages, it is delivered to the Governor of Texas 4-H Congress for his or her signature or veto.

We are excited to be making some changes to Texas 4-H Congress! Texas 4-H Congress will be held in Austin, TX on July 14-17, 2024. At Texas 4-H Congress we have a Youth Leadership Team that who serves in the various Legislative Roles at Congress, including but not limited to: Governor, Speaker of the House, Lieutenant Governor, and Floor Leaders. This year, the opportunity to serve in one of these leadership roles is being opened to Texas 4-H members who have or are currently serving on Texas 4-H Council, any District 4-H Council, or any of the STATE LEVEL Ambassador programs. Applications will open on 4-HOnline on November 1, 2023, and will close on December 5.

County Youth Show Rookie of the Year Award Apps

Guadalupe County Youth Show Rookie of the Year Award is picked from applications from each club. This award, sponsored by the Allan Dreibrodt Memorial, is chosen from the nominees from each club to be recognized at the 2024 Guadalupe County Youth Show. It is only given to a first year 4-Her, regardless of age. Clover Kids are not eligible. Each club will elect their nominee by ballot and then the nominee will fill out the form. The club then turns their nominee into the county office ALL NOMINATIONS MUST BE INTO THE COUNTY OFFICE BY DECEMBER 20, 2023 From that pool, a judge will choose the best candidate from the applications that can be found on our county website at <u>http://guadalupe.agrilife.org/?page_id=75</u>

All of the Rookie Nominees will be recognized around noon at the Youth Show Saturday Auction! Please be aware, there is ALSO a Guadalupe County 4-H Rookie of the Year awards that will be distributed at the 4-H Banquet in August 2024.

County 4-H Christmas Tree Contest, Tentative Nov. 27 at 5:00pm

We will be working with 1st United Bank of Seguin again this year, and they will be buying pizza for all the 4 -Hers! I therefore need a number of how many will be coming from each club by November 17! ALL 4-H CLUBS in Guadalupe County should participate in this event! The point of the contest is to give the county a chance to mingle and display their trees in the same place. You are allowed to set one up somewhere else, but your primary tree will be at the location in Seguin! We will decorate November 27 at 5pm. Remember, lights are not allowed unless they are battery-powered. Additionally, ONLY the tree and the decorations on it (Including tree skirt) will be judged.

San Antonio Stock Show School Tour Guides Needed for 2024

We are looking for 4-Hers in the 8-12 grades to be tour guides for the SALE Stock Show. Entry Deadline, December 10. The days for school tours this year will be February 13-16 AND February 20-23. I need to know if you are doing it with a partner and who that partner is, as well as which day you want to do it. Do not pick a day when you must enter or show your animal projects. This is a great opportunity to get state-wide leadership for your recordbook and college applications, not to mention it is a LOT of fun!

You must be at least 8th grade to participate in this event! As a tour guide, you will be responsible for around 30 kids, leading them around the SALE fair grounds! You must also dress properly, as you are representing 4-H and the San Antonio Stock show!! Remember, you must enter through the county, and not individually!

4-H Ag Project Information for October

<u>Horse Project</u>

The Horse Project will be in for its 5th year in 2023-2024. This includes horse riding (western, possibly English too), speed events, horse judging, horse quiz bowl and care/maintenance of horses. County Stock Show Entry Night

Will be held Wednesday, November 15 until 6:30pm at the county extension office. Do not wait until the last minute to register for the youth show and major shows! Forms should be out very soon. Please note, there will be a new late fee for late entries this year...all entries on or after November 20 will be charged a \$100 fee per exhibitor.

Quality Counts Program (Required for ALL Major Shows)

Quality Counts is designed to teach young people the importance of displaying good character in carrying out livestock projects, and in every aspect of their lives. Exhibitors will have to complete the test once it is started. Exhibitors must achieve 80% or great to pass the exam, but can take it as many times as needed. Exhibitors will be tested on the content potentially three times in their livestock showing career: junior (grade 3-5), intermediate (grade 6-8), and senior (grade 9-12).
