# New County 4-H Fundraiser: Selling Sponsorship Signs

4-Hers will be selling sponsorships for the year! Each year, 4-Hers will be asked to try and sell at least one sponsorship! If they do, their 4-H fee will be paid for the 2024-2025 4-H year! Please read over the form! You can pick them up here at the extension office or I can email you the PDF. **The deadline to sell sponsorship signs is May 31, 2024.** 

This is for any and all 4-Hers to sell! They can send the sponsorship form to anyone! The sponsors could be parents, grandparents, businesses, here in county or out of county. If they kids can ask, that's always nice, and we will give the signs to the kids to deliver to their sponsor, but **every kid that sells one will get their 4-H fee paid for next year.**Depending on the sponsorship level, we will do for each sponsor:

- \$200 Sponsor sign
- \$300 Sponsor Sign and Metal 4-H Cup
- \$400 Sponsor Sign, Metal 4-H Cup, Name on banner we will be making to hang at 4-H events all year. Announced at banquet All sponsors will also be recognized on social media

The monies will help to pay for a number of things including:

- County 4-H Awards Ceremony and Banquet
- District and State 4-H Contest Fees
- National & International 4-H Experiences, National 4-H Shooting Sports Contest
- Enrollment fees of youth that sell a sponsorship

## **County Photography Contest: Deadline Extended to Mar 3**

<u>COUNTY PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST:</u> The rules for the 2023-2024 State Contest are posted <u>HERE</u>. Some of the rules have been revised (noted in the PDF), please note that the COUNTY DEADLINE EXTENDED to SUNDAY, MARCH 3rd. Only the 1st place senior photos from county will go to the state contest! Eligibility of Photos: Each 4-H member may enter up to ten (10) photos. No more than two photos in a single category. These photos must be taken by the 4-H member between March 2023 and March 2024.

**Type of Photos:** Can be digital OR printed. All digital photos will be uploaded to <a href="https://www.dropbox.com/request/tqQFHEyFO1vvBllxQATx">https://www.dropbox.com/request/tqQFHEyFO1vvBllxQATx</a> All photos must be labeled the same as the district photos.

#### FOR DIGITAL PHOTOS

**Type of Photos:** Can be from digital camera or cellphone. Must be saved as a .jpg or .jpeg file and be less than 5 MB per photo. Aspect ratio should be standard photo size (3x5, 7x9, 8x10, etc) and should NOT be edited on a digital device. There is a category for that.

### **FOR PRINTED PHOTOS**

**Size of Photographs:** Each photograph must be 8 inches by 10 inches in dimension

Mounting of Photographs: All prints must be securely and permanently mounted solid on black or white PHOTO-GRAPHIC MOUNT BOARD (mat board material) or a THIN FOAM BOARD no larger than 8 inches by 10 inches suitable for hanging without an additional frame. Masonite, photo folders, corrugated cardboard or thin poster board is not acceptable. Double faced tape, glue or rubber cement is not allowed for mounting purposes. (Use dry mounting if possible.) Matting (of any kind) is not allowed and will result in disqualification. Some resources for mounting supplies include: Hobby Lobby, Michaels

## Texas 4-H Congress County Delegate Applications Due Soon

Texas 4-H Congress (July 14-17, 2024) is a four-day mock legislative experience for 4-H members going into 9th grade – through those who just graduated 12th Grade (at the time of the event). During this time, 4-H members assume the roles of legislators, lobbyists, and press corps to gain a first-hand understanding of how the legislative process works.

### How to Register:

Registration for this event is very LIMITED. Due to the constraints of the venue itself, each District is allotted only 20 House/Senate Delegate positions across our District. Urban Counties (Bexar & Travis) are designated 2 slots each, 4-H Military members are designated 2 slots, and Prairie View/CEP is allotted 4 slots. Due to these limitations, registration for this event is not open for first come, first on 4HOnline, instead each County will submit a **Nomination List (attached Word Doc)** of the members they'd like to send to this event.

All NOMINATIONS ARE DUE TO THE COUNTY OFFICE BY MARCH 15. The Nominations will be judged to put the order of nominations on the list. All nominations will be included on the list, however the top one on the list will get first choice, etc.

Once all nomination lists are compiled, the District 10 Office will select our 20 delegates. Additionally, there will be a district alternate list in the event other Districts do not fill their slots. Accepted delegates will be notified by April 1, 2024 to begin registration on 4HOnline.

<u>Press Corps & Lobbyist</u>: Additionally, there are special roles for members to fill during 4-H Congress (See description of all roles on pg. 4-5 of the Letter). Applications for the 2024 Texas 4-H Congress Press Corps and Lobbyist roles are due on 4HOnline on **March 14, 2024.** I would encourage youth who are applying for one of these roles to also place their names on their County's Nomination List, so that if they are not selected, they are still considered to attend in a different role.

<u>Submitting a Bill:</u> As a reminder, *all* youth who are planning on attending are required to submit a bill. A guide to assist in writing and developing a bill as well as the link to the submission form can be found at: <a href="https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/events/congress/">https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/events/congress/</a> under Bill Submissions. There are also three past Bill Books posted so that you can see past Bills submitted. If you have any questions, please let me know. I know for new agents, this event can be a bit overwhelming – so please let me know how I can help you through this process. We are looking forward to a great Congress this year.

### Texas 4-H Congress Participant Roles

### • House or Senate Members:

- These roles are primarily for 4-H members that have never participated in Texas 4-HCongress. Members serving in the House or Senate should be prepared and able to speak about issues affecting Texas and Texas youth. Issues the 4-H member will be speaking about may or may not be related to the subject matter of the bill they submitted. House and Senate members will be participating in a variety of professional settings such as committee meetings, chamber sessions, and may be lobbied or questioned on different issues by the Lobbyist group and/or the Press Corps. Assignments are made by the State4-H Office.
- ♦ House and Senate members allotted to participate: 260

### • Lobbyists:

- The responsibility of the Lobbyist group is to identify certain bills and then lobby members of the House and Senate to either pass or defeat the bill. Lobbyist members should be prepared and be comfortable approaching others who may have a different opinion on legislative topics. The Lobbyist group will hold a private reception for certain House and Senate Members, along with Congress Leadership.
- Applications to be considered for a Lobbyist position will be submitted online through 4HOnline. The online application opens February 15 and closes March 17. Applicants will be notified whether they have been accepted to serve in the Lobbyist role. If not selected and space is available, they could apply to be part of the district delegation.
- ♦ Lobbyist allotted to participate: 14

### Press Corps:

- Texas 4-H Congress Press Corps members can be either first time or returning 4-H members. Individuals applying for the Press Corps should have strong skills in writing, word processing, interviewing, photography, and focused on making deadlines. The Press Corps group is responsible for publishing daily articles, videotaping, and helping maintain a Texas 4-H social media presence. Press Corps members may not be able to attend certain activities because of publication deadlines.
- ♦ Applications to be considered for a Press Corp position will be submitted online through 4HOnline. Applications are open February I − March 17. Applicants will be notified of their selection to serve in the Press Corps. If not selected and space is available, they could apply to be part of the district delegation.
- Press Corps members allotted to participate up to 15.

### Design Brief (Theme) for 2024: Dream

"Dream" serves as the ultimate source of inspiration for this fashion concept. The concept revolves around the multifaceted nature of dreams, whether they are the surreal visions that captivate a sleeping mind or the vivid aspirations that fuel the conscious soul. The fashion narrative will blur the lines between reality and reverie, creating a visual story that celebrates the ethereal and the tangible. This concept invites designers to translate the essence of dreams into fashion, evoking a sense of wonder, mystery, and endless possibility.

Categories: A 4-H member may compete in only ONE category for Storyboard. Categories include:

- Wearable: Clothing that can be worn. Includes items such as pants, shorts, skirts, etc.
- Accessory: Includes items such as belts, purses, bags, hats, etc.
- Jewelry: Includes necklaces, bracelets, rings, earrings, etc.
- Pet Clothing: Includes items that can be worn by a pet or any other animal.
- **Home Décor:** items that are easy to move and make a home visually appealing, examples of home décor items include: throw pillows, table runner, or wall hanging.
- **Home Furnishings**: items that make a home comfortable for living or working in. Examples include: couch, ottoman, chair, tables, desks, beds and the like.

Storyboards can be created using a digital platform including but not limited to Canva, Picmonkey, InDesign, Illustrator, Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, and PowerPoint. All entries saved as a PDF, jpeg, jpg or png. Recommended size is 18" X 24".

### **Application Process:**

- Applications will be released on the Texas Youth Livestock and Agriculture website (<u>www.texasyouthlivestock.com</u>) on February 15,
- Student will complete the application and enter the contact information of supervising CEA (Matt Miranda)
- CEA will be automatically emailed a recommendation survey
- A selection committee will review the applications and accept up to 25 participants per short course
- Applications are due April 15, 2024

<u>Information:</u> The Texas 4-H Center will host a series of camps & events for 4-H members of all ages during the upcoming months. Please see camp/event information below:

- 2024 Summer Camp Schedule: County Camp, Prime Time & Horizons Schedule
- Refashion Retreat (FLYER): It's time to let your creative juices flow at 4-H Refashion Retreat! The event will be held March I-3, 2024, at the Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood. Youth registration is \$170 and must have an adult chaperone accompanying them. Chaperone registration is free. Space is limited to 24 youth.
- Lone Star Splash Camp (FLYER): The Texas 4-H Water Ambassadors are hosting the Lone Star 4-H Splash Camp on April 26-28. This event is open to 6th-8th grade students. Registration opens February 5 on the Texas 4-H Conference Center website and will CLOSE April 5<sup>th</sup>. Youth will be involved in project-based learning and lots of fun water activities! Registration is \$210 per student.
- Aperture Academy (FLYER): Aperture Academy is a beginner's photography camp for youth entering grades 6-8 and is scheduled for July 7-10. All cameras, equipment, and supplies for the camp will be provided. No prior knowledge or experience of photography is required. Registration is open & space is limited to 25.

# Texas 4-H Horse Validation, March 1-May 1, 2024

<u>Information:</u> 4-H exhibitors wishing to participate in the 2024 District & State Horse show must validate any horses that will be used in competition. ALL horses must be validated/re-validated each year. There is no limit to the number of horses that can be validated. You are encouraged to validate all horses that may possibly be shown at district and/or state shows. Only state validated horses can be substituted in the event that a validated horse becomes unusable due to lameness, sickness, etc.

### **VALIDATION ENTRY PERIODS & FEES**

Families can submit payment by credit card ONLY.

From March I – April 15, the validation cost for each horse is \$10.00. The \$10.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the April 15th deadline and the payment is processed.

From April 16 – May 1, the validation cost for each horse is \$20.00. The \$20.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the May 1st deadline and the payment is processed.

From May 2-5, the validation cost for each horse is \$250.00.

### **HOW TO VALIDATE YOUR HORSE:**

Horse Validation will take place on 4HOnline. The family will receive an automated message from 4-H Online when the County Extension Agent has approved the horse at the county level. **This approval does NOT guarantee eligibility**. After it is approved at the county level, the validation will then be reviewed at the state level. The family will be notified by June 1<sub>st</sub> if there are <u>any issues</u> with the validation at the state level. We will begin to review validations at the state level on March 1<sub>st</sub> and will be working closely with families and agents to fix errors as quickly as possible prior to the validation deadline.

#### **VALIDATION INSTRUCTIONS:**

Each validation must include front view, right side view, and left side view images. The entire horse should be included in the photo and markings should be clearly visible. If the horse is registered, a copy of the registration papers must be uploaded. These papers must list the 4-Her, sibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent or legal guardian as the current owner. If the ownership is in the process of being transferred, please list "pending" in the registration number area. Once the updated registration papers have been received, please deliver a new copy to your County Office. Image uploads in 4-H Online must be in the form of a .jpg, .gif or .png file.

**Families should validate each horse only one time.** Once the horse is validated, any sibling within that family in 4-H Online is eligible to show the horse at their district show and/or the State 4-H Horse Show.

Youth validating a futurity horse must be at least 12 years of age (as of Sept. 1, 2023) and at least in the 6th grade.

#### **LEASE HORSES:**

Lease horses are eligible to be validated and shown at District and State 4-H Horse Shows. An official Texas 4-H Horse Lease Agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and the supervising County Extension Agent. The lease period must include, at minimum, May Ist to August 31st of the current 4-H year. The lease agreement form can be found on <a href="https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/">https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/</a> and must be uploaded in 4-H Online at the time of validation.

# Steer/Heifer Tags and State Fair Tags, Deadline April 4

Steer and heifer tags will be \$25 dollars again this year and are DUE on April 4, 2024. Contact Kim at the extension office to order your tags any time until April 4.

If you are planning on showing a pig, sheep or goat at the State Fair of Texas in October, you need to purchase tags for validation. <u>Tags are \$20.00 each and the deadline is April 4</u> as well. State Fair and Steer/Heifer validation will take place in June. Remember, you MUST purchase a tag for validation by April 4!
